REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION OF
THE BOARD ON PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY

This matter is before the Board on an Ad Hoc Hearing Committee's finding that Respondents Rachelle S. Young and John P. Mahoney, who are members of the same firm, violated a term of their probation and should be required to serve thirty-day suspensions. Respondents concede that they violated a term of their probation and consent to having their probation revoked. Neither party has filed an exception, time having expired.

Board Rule 18.4(a) provides, in relevant part: “In the absence of timely filed exceptions, the Board shall file the Hearing Committee Report with the Court within twenty days of the filing of the Hearing Committee Report with such recommendations, if any, as it may deem appropriate.”

The Board has reviewed the Report and Recommendation of the Ad Hoc Hearing Committee and determined that it should be filed with the Court with no additional recommendations. Accordingly, the Board recommends that probation be revoked for both Respondents and that they be required to serve thirty-day suspensions, with Respondent Mahoney’s thirty-day suspension to begin immediately and Respondent Young’s thirty-day suspension to begin immediately after completion of Respondent Mahoney’s suspension.
