Myles V. Lynk, is a past president of the D.C. Bar and served on the Planning Committee for the D.C. Bar's 2020 Conference Celebrating the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. He also chaired the D.C. Bar's Client Security Trust Fund and was a member of the D.C. Bar's Legal Ethics Committee. Myles served on the Board of Directors of the Women's Legal Defense Fund (now the National Partnership of Women and Families) and the Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights Under Law.

Myles was a partner in the Washington, D.C., office of a national law firm before serving as the Peter Kiewit Foundation Professor of Law and the Legal Profession at the Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law, Arizona State University, from 2000 to 2019, specializing in legal ethics and civil procedure. He currently serves as Senior Assistant Disciplinary Counsel for appellate litigation in the District of Columbia Office of Disciplinary Counsel.

In the American Bar Association (ABA), among other roles, Myles served on the Board of Governors, chaired the Section of Individual Rights and Responsibilities (now Civil Rights and Social Justice), the Standing Committee on Ethics and Professional Responsibility, and the Standing Committee on Professional Regulation, and was a liaison to the ABA's Standing Committee on Election Law.
