The Justice Gap

A 2017 study found that 86% of the legal needs of poor and low-income citizens received inadequate or no attention

The most common legal problems they face include employment, housing, consumer debt, insurance, family matters, etc.

Federally funded legal services are limited to people and families at or below 125% of the federal poverty limit (in 2020, \$15,950 for individuals and \$32,750 for a family of four)

Some organizations offer free services to people with incomes up to 200% of the federal poverty limit


Individuals between 200% and 400% generally have the same needs and inability to pay full lawyer rates, but no free assistance

The "Low Bono" Solution

- Massive unmet need for legal services among clients who cannot afford to pay full rates
- And roughly three quarters of lawyers work in firms of 5 or fewer lawyers
 - Generally cannot afford to devote extended time to matters that generate no income
- The Legal Services Corporation and others have recognized that offering services at reduced rates may permit these lawyers to provide a valuable service without sacrificing their practice

Low Bono = Pro Bono

- ABA Model Rule of Professional Conduct 6.1 recognizes "delivery of legal services at no fee or substantially reduced fee to individuals" as pro bono service
- But the ABA encourages lawyers first to satisfy their pro bono obligation, if possible, by providing free services
- DC Rule of Professional Conduct 6.1 likewise defines pro bono to include offering services at a substantially reduced fee, but without the caveat that lawyers should focus first on traditional pro bono
- Thus, solo practitioners and lawyers in small firms can satisfy their ethical obligation to provide pro bono service by offering services at substantially reduced rates – but how?




