Most cars manufactured in the past three years come with event data recorders, sometimes known as "black boxes." These devices are computers that record and store crash data in the event of an accident. Under regulations adopted by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the event data recorders must record 15 data inputs. They include engine rpm, steering, the length and severity of the crash, and the braking during the crash. The data on the devices are intentionally difficult to access. 
# How to Collect Video Evidence for Your **Injury Case**




# Wells Fargo Data Breach (July 2017)

- Attorney for subpoenaed party accidentally disclosed "copious spreadsheets with customers' names, SSN#, financial details..."
- No confidentiality agreement or protective order
- Receiving party took information to the New York Times
- Attorney testified that she misunderstood discovery software → reviewed only a small subset of total docs that appeared in doc viewer
- Thousands of docs unreviewed, files flagged for redaction were not redacted

Souls are thrown into a pit of darkness, endlessly beaten and tortured by demons.


#### Circle IX: Treachery

(Circle VIII, Ditch 4 to be exact. Take a left at the pit of darkness.)



i.e. @amazon.com emails


Date ranges outside of scope
