food service contract for the District of Columbia School System. As a member of the District of Columbia Community, the D.C. Bar is very much committed to providing assistance where possible. As this matter involving the food service contract appears to involve Government Contracts issues we would like to volunteer the services of a panel of our members who are Government Contracts experts to assist in any way you deem appropriate.

We believe we could help in two (2) specific ways. First, since we have no vested interest in the matter and our members will provide services on a volunteer basis we could offer an independent legal assessment of the current solicitation and resulting food service contract for the consideration of the D.C. Financial Authority and the Superintendent.

Second, if the School System and the Financial Authority determine that there is a need to change any aspect of the current contract our panel could act as an independent mediator between the contractor and the School System, noting potential alternatives the parties may not have considered. Mediation is often a most efficient way to avoid long drawn out disputes.

We are, of course, willing to consider providing assistance in any other way the School System or the Financial Authority may believe is appropriate.
