Ben Wiseman is the Director of the Office of Consumer Protection in the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia, where he oversees a staff of lawyers, paralegals, mediators, and investigators engaged in consumer protection enforcement and outreach activities for the Office. Mr. Wiseman previously served in the Office of Consumer Protection as an Assistant Attorney General. In that role he served as the Office's lead privacy attorney and was responsible for monitoring compliance with state and federal privacy and consumer-protection laws, investigating businesses that fail to protect consumers' personal information, and educating the public on privacy matters.
